### COLLEGE SEARCHES

One of our favorite sites for a college search is: [www.bigfuture.collegeboard.org](http://www.bigfuture.collegeboard.org). If you have a user name and password, you can save your searches. However, you do not need to have a user name and password to use the college search option at the top of the page.

There are 3,754 schools on this site! In order to narrow down your options, use the filters on the left side of the screen. The best ones to start with are "Location" and "Majors and Learning Environment."

Once your SAT scores are available, you can enter them in the filter titled "Test Scores & Selectivity" to help you determine if a school is appropriate for you academically.

Once you have a list of 15-20 schools, you can research each of them thoroughly!

Visiting campuses is key!! Check out as many campuses as possible!

## **APPLYING TO COLLEGE FAQs**

1. When should I start? The Summer before your Senior year is the best time to start. Most students do the majority of their application work in the Fall of their senior year.
2. How many colleges should I apply to? Five to eight college is the recommended number. They should all be colleges you'd be happy to attend. It's good to apply to some colleges that are a bit of a stretch for you and some that you feel will likely admit you. But, most should feel like good, realistic matches.
3. Should I apply early? It depends. If you are sure about which college you want to attend, early decision or early action might be the best choice for you. If you're not sure, keep in mind that some early application plans require you to commit early. You may want to keep your options open.
4. What is the Common Application? The Common Application is a standardized application used by more than 500 colleges. You fill out the application once and electronically send it to different colleges. You may need to submit additional or separate documents to some colleges.
5. Should I apply to colleges if my SAT scores or grades are below their published ranges? Yes! The numbers listed online are averages! Colleges are looking for all kinds of students with different talents, abilities, and backgrounds.
