

EXTRA/CO-CURRICULAR ACADEMIC ELIGIBILITY
LEAVITT AREA HIGH SCHOOL and TRIPP MIDDLE SCHOOL

Leavitt Area High School:

Each student who participates in any extra/co-curricular activity sponsored by Leavitt Area High School must take a minimum of six classes and may fail no more than one class to be eligible to participate in extra/co-curricular activities. A student who is failing more than one subject, is not passing five full-time subjects at the nine-week mark at the close of the grading period will be ineligible to practice, participate or play in any extra/co-curricular activity for the next grading period.

Beginning with the class of 2018:

Each student who participates in any extra/co-curricular activity sponsored by Leavitt Area High School must take a minimum of six classes. Additionally, students must maintain a score of 2.0 or above in all standards, in all classes. This includes the work ethic and behavior standards. A student who is not earning a score of 2.0 or above in all standards at the nine-week mark at the close of the grading period will be ineligible to practice, participate or play in any extra/co-curricular activity for the next grading period.

For the first grading period of each school year, eligibility will be determined by the fourth quarter grades of the previous spring. Students must earn credit in all classes at the end of the year in order to be academically eligible for quarter 1 activities. Students, who have earned a 2.0 in all standards in a course but not earned an overall course grade of 2.6, can recover the credit through a credit recovery program offered through Leavitt Area High School during the summer in order to become academically eligible for quarter 1 activities. Students not earning credit in a first semester course(s) must develop a plan with the teacher of that course(s) to recover credit using the Credit Recovery Plan form. The intent of this policy is to ensure that students are earning the credits for the courses in which they are enrolled in order to be eligible for fall activities, while at the same accommodating this requirement by providing opportunity through credit recovery.

All incoming freshmen will be academically eligible for extra/co-curricular activities, provided they are enrolled as a full-time student.

Tripp Middle School:

Each student who participates in any extra/co-curricular activity sponsored by Tripp Middle School must have earned passing grades in all courses, as determined at the end of the previous grading period, and be enrolled as a full-time student.

For the purpose of determining eligibility for the first trimester of the year, the reference point will be the third trimester grades of the previous year. All incoming seventh graders will be academically eligible for extra/co-curricular activities, provided they are enrolled as a full-time student. A student who is failing in any subject at the year-end of seventh grade will be ineligible to tryout, practice, participate or play in any extra/co-curricular activity until September 30th of their eighth grade year when eligibility will be reviewed.

Eligibility will be reviewed on the 15th and 30th of each month, or two weeks after the close of the previous grades. A student who is failing when eligibility is reviewed, will be ineligible to tryout, play, or practice in any extra/co-curricular activity until the next eligibility review. The student will not be allowed to participate in games until they are passing all classes. If at the end of the probationary two weeks, the student is still not passing all classes, the student will be removed from the team. Eligibility will be determined by trimester grades, not the cumulative average.

Neither correspondence courses nor summer school courses will be considered for the purpose of maintaining extra/co-curricular eligibility.
